- * the purchase of safety apparel (ie. head gear, elbow pads)
- * \$50.00 per year per affected child, under the age of 18 years, towards the purchase of adequate footwear
- * assistance with in-hospital costs during an extended visit
- * assistance with out of province medical costs
- * summer camps
- * an educational opportunity for a family member to increase their knowledge of hemophilia

Saskatoon Health Region invites you to get involved in protecting your health and safety by helping us build our new Safety Alert System!



If you or your family member are feeling concerned about your safety, please speak with a member of your care team first. If you are still concerned, please call:

306-655-1600



The Safety Alert System line is **available 24 hours a day**, **7 days a week**. You'll speak to one of our friendly coordinators who will fill out your report for you and determine what level of assistance you may need.



The coordinator you speak with will give you a tracking number. Please write this number down. At any time, you can call back and check on the status of your report using your tracking number.

The Safety Reporting Phone Number and How to Use It

This past spring was my first trip to the emergency department with my own child. As a health care professional I was able to understand the system and how it worked, what I could do in order to help our visit and yet, emotions welled up at times leaving me wanting to just get what we need and get back to our home and our safety.

As parents when we make the decision to go to emergency or connect with a clinic, it might mean that other things in your day to day life need to be changed or put on hold. It means sitting in an uncomfortable waiting area, it means describing your situation to more than just one health care professional, it means wondering if this really is an emergency and do I really need to be here. Waiting, finding out what tests need to be ordered, sitting or lying down for an uncomfortable scan. Trying to communicate about a particular need and the urgency of being treated first regardless of the injury can be a frustrating and even devastating task.

One concern that has come to our attention over the past couple of years is how the Treat First card is under recognized in the emergency room department. In order to receive best care, there are a couple of things you can do when you feel overwhelmed. The first is to be sure to show your TreatFirst card and explain you work with a hematologist who has provided recommended treatment. If you find you are not being listened to, ask to speak with a manager. If this does not happen or is taking more than 30 minutes, you can then phone the safety reporting line.

As a patient in our health region, it's important that you know that this safety line is about getting you proper care in the time you need it. Many people are worried that it will impact their care and they want to avoid any confrontation. This is about safety and making the hospital and place for you to receive the treatment you need. When you phone this line, you will provide your information and they will have someone respond immediately.

The number is posted around the hospital and should be at every bedside. You can also talk to us about putting it on your Treat First Card so it's with all of your other information. As always, let us know if you have any questions about this number and how to use it.

Reminders to Those with a Bleeding Disorder Who Will be Undergoing Surgical or Dental Procedures

Our goal is to always provide our clients with a safe and effective plan of care while also keeping your optimal health and recovery in mind. In order to prevent bleeding complications, we ask that you remind your physician or dentist of your bleeding disorder on each visit. Take ownership and be proud to share with healthcare professionals what you know about your condition! Become familiar with your bleeding disorder and know the name of products you need to prevent a bleeding episode. Show your physician and/or dentist your Factor First / Treat First card on a pre-op visit/assessment. Ensure these professionals are aware to call us directly with any questions that arise.

Always ensure that you let the Saskatchewan Bleeding Disorder Team know well in advance of the procedure: We need at least 2 weeks' notice of a date booked for surgical or dental procedures. A phone call discussion with the nurse coordinator ahead of time can provide you with clarity on details for your surgery and hospital stay.

Any clients on home infusion should not have to bring in their product from home if their product is administered in hospital. Preparing yourself and family should be all that is expected of you.

The Nurse Coordinator will:

Ensure coagulation product orders are prepared and reviewed with the Hematologist familiar with you. Process the orders by mail/fax once the nurse educator and staff nurses have been educated on how to mix and administer the product.

- Alert the transfusion lab staff to arrange for appropriate coagulation product to be ordered in from CBS (Canadian Blood Services), and be available.
- Alert the coagulation lab staff of lab work details to ensure they have adequate staff to process the factor level results requested, and report these to the Hematologist/nurse coordinator.
- Provide ongoing support to ward staff unfamiliar with factor concentrates and/or specific lab work requests.
- Ensure clarification prior to your discharge on the number of follow-up doses of factor to be given at home and/or a local hospital setting. (Also determine who will be administering these doses).

Insurance and Medical Conditions—

Considering Insurance? There can be a lot of information and a lot to consider when looking at medical insurance for you or your family. The Canadian Hemophilia Society has provided a breakdown of what you should consider when looking at insurance.

Start at the CHS website <u>http://www.hemophilia.ca/en/</u>. On the left menu bar click on Support and Education. From the new menu pick Insurance Coverage.

Here you will find three categories:

Individual Insurance Coverage – Working with a licensed insurance broker, anticipating needs, knowing your policy, disclosing your health status guaranteed insurability policies, and much more.

Travel Insurance Coverage – Examples of travel insurance and issuers, travel outside your province, studying abroad and away from your province, visitors and new arrivals to Canada and other helpful tips.

Provincial Drug Insurance – Provincial coverage, coverage levels for prescriptions drugs frequently used, anti-retroviral drug plans and provincial drug coverage and chronic Hepatitis C medication.

You can also find information on the OmbudServices for Life and Health Insurance (<u>www.olhi.ca</u>).

Did you know that Children's Wish Foundation has granted over 20,000 wishes in the last 30 years? And they do it because wishes make a difference. "Joy is a wonder drug" "Wishes work wonders" (Children's Wish Foundation Website)

Children with moderate and severe hemophilia and other severe bleeding disorders between the ages of 3-17 can qualify for a wish. Typically the wishes fall into one of three categories: travel, item or celebrity contact (often involves travel). 
Anyone can make a referral but the parents or guardians must also express interest to the Foundation. Our

Hemophilia Saskatchewan "200 Club"

Purpose: To provide a stable, reliable, predictable, ongoing and adequate source for funding. If we can find at least 100 families, groups or individuals who will pledge a minimum of \$200 per year on an ongoing basis for the foreseeable future, Hemophilia Saskatchewan would be assured of a minimum income of \$20,000 per year.

The 200 Club is different from a one-time financial campaign, because it is ongoing, every year for the foreseeable future.

The fund would be administered by the treasurer, who would issue receipts for income at year end. Note that the government allows a 43% tax credit for donations over \$200.

A commitment to the 200 Club is made on the understanding that if the contributors ' financial situation changes, the yearly commitment could be discontinued at any time.

The 200 Club is not meant to be an elite, exclusive club. It is a group of concerned committed people who want to see Hemophilia Saskatchewan become self-sufficient, not depending on any help from CHS.

Client Services Policy

APPROVED BY HEMOPHILIA SASKATCHEWAN BOARD OF DIRECTORS (March 29, 2014)

PREAMBLE

Client Services are available to registered members of Hemophilia Saskatchewan (HSK) who are cared for by the Saskatchewan Bleeding Disorders Program (SBDP). Please note that some services are available only to members who meet specific criteria. Contact HSK for any clarification.

To be eligible for reimbursement: 1) a Request for Service form must be completed and authorized by the most responsible practitioner (Group A: Client Services) OR the necessary application form must be completed and additional authorization may be required (Group B: Additional Programs), AND 2) a completed HSK membership application form must be on file (Groups A and B). Members who are listed under their family membership form need to fill out an individual application once they reach 18 years of age.

The policy outlined below is designed to help HSK members find the assistance they need, and guide the HSK Board of Directors as they attempt to balance the needs of members and their families with the limited resources that are available. Misuse of Client Services and/or Additional Programs may result in suspension of privileges.

POLICY

Client Services and Additional Programs are intended to help our members to defray expenses related to living with bleeding disorders. Services associated with medical treatment (outpatient or inpatient) must be directly related to treatment of bleeding disorders: either the treatment of a bleeding episode or a surgical procedure that requires extended care due to a bleeding disorder. Provision of Client Services and Additional Programs are subject to approval by the HSK Board of Directors and availability of funds, and may change at any time without notice.

Hemophilia Saskatchewan will cover only those expenses that are authorized through the Request for Service form; payment will be provided after service is received. The member is liable for all other expenses. Hemophilia Saskatchewan will <u>not</u> cover expenses that other agencies or extended health care plans cover. Decisions of the Board of Directors, or its designated committees, are <u>final</u>.

PROCEDURES

All requests for reimbursement must be in writing. Members must complete the Request for Service (or other form for Additional Programs), including any necessary authorizations, and provide the form <u>and</u> original receipts to HSK for reimbursement. The HSK Board of Directors reserves the right to set limits on individual allocations that may be authorized (up to \$750/member/year under Group A; maximums as specified by program under Group B).

All Client Service claims must be made within six months of receiving the service.

GROUP A: CLIENT SERVICES WILL COVER (FULLY OR PARTIALLY):

Please read preamble and policy to ensure you qualify. Request for Service form required.

- TV while member (with bleeding disorder or carrier) is in hospital for treatment of bleeding disorder.
- Parking fees for members and family (<u>not</u> friends) while member is an outpatient or in hospital for treatment of bleeding disorder (one vehicle per day to current daily maximum; NOTE: parking for clinic visits at RUH may be covered through SBDP). Members may remit original receipts for hospital parking within six months of date on receipt for parking not covered through SBDP (i.e., for SBDP clinic days at Regina or Prince Albert).
- Expenses for medical supplies over and above those provided by Saskatchewan Health SAIL program to be considered by the HSK Board on an individual basis.
- Orthopedic splints and boots or orthotic inserts (prescribed by SBDP physiotherapist)
- Expenses (i.e., mileage) associated with travel for out-of-town medical care for treatment of bleeding disorder. This service is for members living >100 km from point of care (typically Saskatoon or Regina).
- Accommodation for members living >100 km from point of care to attend SBDP clinic or for other bleeding disorder related hospital visits – up to a maximum of \$75 per night (for up to five nights per year) for accommodation for medical stays. In Saskatoon, accommodations are available at Laura's Lodge, Netty's Nest, or Ronald McDonald House or members can choose to stay at a hotel of their choice.
- Basic model Medic Alert bracelets or necklaces (limit: one every two years) and the first year enrollment fee; if the bracelet/necklace is lost or broken within the two-year period, HSK will cover half the replacement cost only.
- Ambulance service one ambulance per year up to 50% of the cost (maximum of \$350) if no other source of funding available.

GROUP B: ADDITIONAL PROGRAMS

For the following services, the Request for Service Form is not required; however, other forms and supporting documentation (such as Physiotherapist approval, etc.) may be necessary.

- Physical Activity Bursary program: this program provides financial encouragement for families to explore appropriate sport activities for children, youth and adults with bleeding disorders. Families are required to fill out the Physical Activity Bursary application form, which <u>must</u> be approved by the SBDP Physiotherapist. Eligible members may apply for one bursary per year, to a maximum of \$250. Forms are available from the SBDP Physiotherapist or HSK.
- Funds are available through the Tavis Duncan foundation to assist with the following expenses (separate application required; form available from HSK):
 - In-hospital costs during an extended visit
 - Out of province medical costs
 - Quality footwear \$50/pair per year (for children under 18 only)
 - Safety apparel (helmets, knee and elbow pads)
 - Summer camps
 - Educational opportunity for a family member to increase their knowledge of hemophilia

CLIENT SERVICES WILL NOT COVER:

- Educational expenses/re-training expenses other than those specified above
- Routine living or medical expenses, equally incurred by those with or without a bleeding disorder (e.g., dental claims)
- Commercial health spa memberships
- Winter boots and work-related footwear
- HSK reserves the right to disqualify any request for service which has not been authorized.


