AGM Family Weekend



My name is Justin Lockhart and at three months old my son, Jayden, was diagnosed with Severe Type A Hemophilia. Since this didn't run in our family's genes, we had quite the learning curve ahead. At the time, the only knowledge our family had of Hemophilia was that it had to do with bleeding.

Being part of a family owned and operated furniture and appliance store in Humboldt, SK, has given me a unique opportunity to host a local fundraising and awareness event for Hemophilia in our community. My father, Kim Lockhart, and I decided to put this campaign together to hopefully raise some awareness and money for the Canadian Hemophilia Society and Hemophilia Saskatchewan.

HIRT? gets the Connected to the Community Awards from CWTA



The Canadian Wireless Telecommunications Association (CWTA) celebrated 30 years of cell phone coverage in Canada this spring. They gave 5 "Connected to the Community Awards" in each province. *HIRT*? (Hemophilia Injury Recognition Tool), an injury self-management app for young men with mild hemophilia received this award in both Saskatchewan and Manitoba. The awards were given to the Manitoba and Saskatchewan Bleeding Disorders Programs. Celebrations were held March 17th in Regina and March 18th in Winnipeg. *HIRT*? has been developed through evidenced based research and has been supported through research grants from CHS Care-until-Cure Program, Bayer Hemophilia Awards Program (BHAP-Caregiver awards 2011, 2014) and the

CHS-Baxter Inherited Bleeding Disorder Fellowship for Nurses and Allied Health Care professionals.

Tavis Duncan Foundation

Through the Tavis Duncan Foundation, Hemophilia Saskatchewan is able to offer help for parents seeking to defray a percentage of the costs associated with the maintenance and treatment of children with hemophilia. Application for coverage is to be made in advance, if possible. Applicants must be registered members of Hemophilia Saskatchewan.

The Foundation will reimburse for items and/or expenses such as:

- * the purchase of safety apparel (ie. head gear, elbow pads)
- * \$50.00 per year per affected child, under the age of 18 years, towards the purchase of adequate footwear
- * assistance with in-hospital costs during an extended visit
- * assistance with out of province medical costs
- * summer camps
- * an educational opportunity for a family member to increase their knowledge of hemophilia

Insurance and Medical Conditions—

Hi everyone- I just want to draw your attention to the useful new link on the Canadian Hemophilia Society website- under Support and Education, the last item in the dropdown menu is INSURANCE.

There are guides to Individual Insurance, Travel Insurance and Provincial Health Plans.

The Individual Insurance section has some excellent advice for considering a policy and some useful links to the OmbudServices for Life and Health Insurance (www.olhi.ca),

There is also information about the Medical Insurance Bureau, a non profit data sharing service where, if you have applied for insurance in the past 7 years, your data may be stored there and shared. You can request to check your information for accuracy. Do so by visiting www.mib.com and completing the request for information or contact the MIB at 416 597 0590.

The Travel Insurance section reviews insurance by province and by the two most common travel insurance policies- Blue Cross and RBC Travel Insurance. There is a link to a helpful Guide to Travel Insurance, which lists questions that you should ask. Please note that information on travel health insurance can be obtained on the Web site of the OmbudService for Life & Health Insurance:

The Provincial Health Plan shows a comparison across Canada of provincial coverage for prescription medications. There are also comparisons for coverage for medications for Bleeding disorders (DDAVP for example), Antiretroviral Therapies, and Hepatitis C therapies.




Children's Wish

Children between the ages of 3 and 17, who have moderate to severe Hemophilia (or other severe bleeding disorders) are eligible to apply for consideration of a wish from the Children's Wish Foundation!

Wishes tend to fall under 3 categories- travel, an item, or a celebrity contact (which often involves travel). Examples have been trips to Disneyworld, home entertainment centers or computers, specific home renovation/decoration projects, contact with a sports or entertainment figure. The idea is that it be something meaningful and special for the child.

They have a One Child, One Wish policy, and will not grant a wish to a child who has previously received a wish from another wish



granting agency. A child who has received a wish grant in the past, can apply for a subsequent wish in the event of a new high-risk life threatening illness.

The process to apply is as follows:

You will need to sign consents for release of information. Your child's doctor or haematologist will be contacted to verify the medical condition. Shelley would then assist you in submitting the wish request, which is then referred to their national office for a decision. If the wish is granted, Shelley would assist you in planning how to fulfill the wish.



Just a friendly reminder!



Just a friendly reminder to contact the Saskatchewan Bleeding Disorders Program (SBDP) at least 2-4 weeks PRIOR to any scheduled surgeries, medical or dental procedures that may cause bleeding. This would ensure we had adequate time to make the required arrangements to control possible bleeding that may occur, as well as to educate the health care personnel that may be involved with your care/treatment. If enough notice isn't received your scheduled surgery, medical or dental procedure could be postponed or even canceled. The Nurse Coordinators with the Saskatchewan Bleeding Disorders Program (SBDP) can be reached at 306-381-4185.
